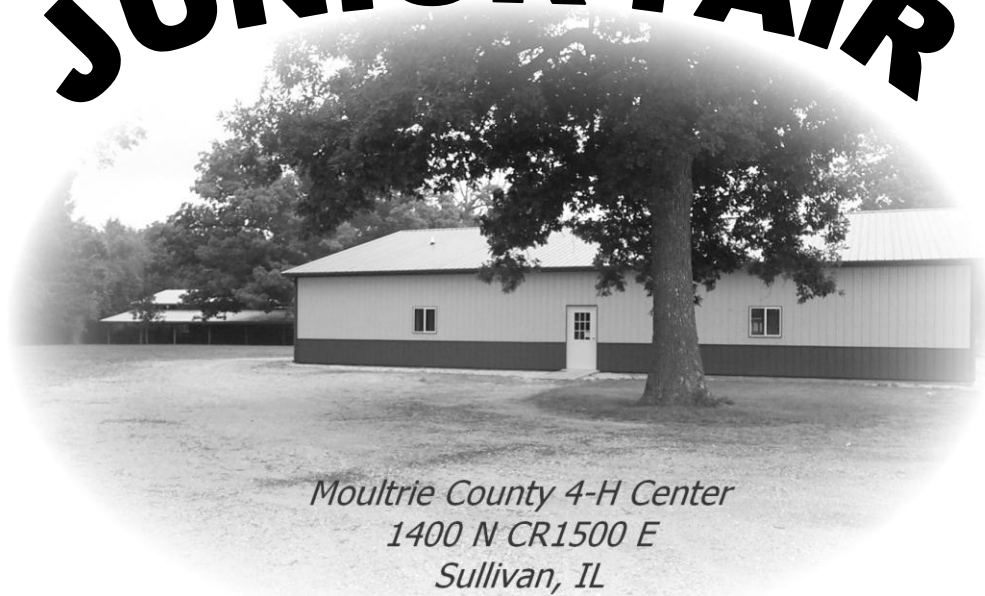

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Junior Show is open to boys and girls who are 8 (eight) years of age or in third grade and not yet 19 (nineteen) years of age on or before September 1 of the year previous to the fair. Birth dates must be on or between 9/2/98-9/1/09.
2. All animals showing in purebred classes must be registered, entered, and exhibited by bona-fide owner. Registration papers must accompany animals to the show. Beef animals must be owned and REGISTERED IN NAME OF EXHIBITOR not later than May 1, 2017. Swine must be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor not later than June 1 - litter registrations will be accepted. All purebred market animals must have breed certification or they will be shown in xbred classes. All animals will be checked and identified with ear tags, tattoos, color markings, etc. at discretion of superintendent. Failure to adhere to these rules may disqualify exhibit from receiving premium monies. Statement to be signed by exhibitor on each entry form: "I hereby certify that I have owned and cared for these exhibits in accordance with the ownership dates outlined for each exhibit. Signed: _____."
3. Illinois livestock health regulations must be complied with. Livestock Premise ID # are voluntary this year. If you have one, please include it on your entry form.
4. Each exhibitor will be limited to two (2) entries in each livestock class. In case of 2 animals in a class, second must be shown by a Junior Exhibitor. Exhibitors must be present and show their own livestock.
5. All entries in the Junior Livestock Show should be made on the official entry blank (blank on back page) by 5:00 p.m. (or sent by email – sullivanfair@hotmail.com on the night before the show.
6. Beef Cattle and Sheep must be on the Fairgrounds and in stalls and pens by 8 a.m. on Friday, July 28. Swine must be on fairgrounds by 7:30 am and Poultry & Rabbits and Horses & Ponies by 8 a.m. on Saturday, July 29.
7. Stalls and pens may be assigned by the entry committee.
8. No livestock may be taken away from the show until officially released by the Fair Management.
9. Exhibitors will furnish their own feed and bedding. Before checks are issued, stalls and pens shall be cleaned and inspected by superintendent.

**2017 Exhibition Livestock Health
Requirements
County Fairs**

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/anim_alregistry/login.php 2. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.

3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.

4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.

5. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.

6. CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.

7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise.

Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate

quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. New examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.

9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited.

Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.

10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate. Illinois Cattle Brucellosis Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle. Tuberculosis Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

Brucellosis 1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following: A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd. B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age. C. Animal originated

from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified) D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis. 2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

Tuberculosis 1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days. 2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free) A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year. B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition. C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

Illinois Swine Identification 1. Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. 2. Ear notch identification is acceptable for barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine. (Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

Brucellosis Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine. Pseudorabies Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine. Out-of-State Swine All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

Identification 1. Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. 2. Ear notch identification is not acceptable for crossbred animals. Brucellosis 1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following: A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd. B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state. 2. Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory. Pseudorabies 1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement. 2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd. 3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies

conducted within the 10 days prior to entry. 4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Illinois Equine
1. All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal. 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted. 3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted. 4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine. **Out-of-State Equine** All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: <http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php> 1. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that

are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal. 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted. 3. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POULTRY

1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested. 2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected. 3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the

show. 4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds. 5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry. 6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. A permit may be obtained by calling (217) 782-4944. Please note: These poultry exhibition requirements do not apply to 4-H and FFA 1-day poultry shows where the entries are taken to the show and returned home the same day. However, a permit is required for out-of-state poultry.

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

1. Beef cattle must be in stalls on the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. On Friday, July 29th
2. Cattle shown in any pair classes must have been shown as individuals by the same exhibitor.
3. Each steer must have been owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor as of January 1st, 2017.
4. Animals in breeding classes must be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor not later than May 1, 2017 except crossbreds on registration only.
5. Animals will be checked and identified with registration papers according to respective breed association's identification (tattoos), except for crossbreds at the discretion of the superintendent.
6. Exhibitors must be present to exhibit their own beef.
7. Female pair classes will be of same breeds except Crossbreds.
8. Ages of all heifers must be listed on the entry blanks.

3. All lambs must have been born since September 1, 2016 and carry lambs teeth.
4. Ewe lambs may not be shown in both ewe lamb and market lamb classes. All Market Lambs will be sorted by weight and face color and put into the market lamb classes. Weighing will begin at 7 am on Friday. Use Class # 140 or #141 on entry form to enter all market lambs.
5. Animals in breeding classes must be owned and registered in the name of exhibitor not later than June 1, 2017.

Judging will begin at 10 a.m. EXHIBITOR MUST BE PRESENT DURING JUDGING OF EXHIBITS TO SHOW THEIR ANIMAL. Entries are limited to one per class. Each exhibitor will be allowed to show only 1 breed in the Light Weight Breeds and only 1 breed in the Heavy Weight Breeds.
